**Re: 2011 Population and dwelling counts – Inukjuak (SGC 2499085)**

Dear Sir,

A detailed review of the 2011 Census counts for the Nordic Village of Inukjuak has been undertaken by Statistics Canada, at the request of M. Gérard Duhaime, Director of the Nunivaat Program at Laval University.

The review involved a detailed analysis of all the documents and procedures used by the census enumerators during the 2006 and 2011 Censuses. The census enumeration records for 2006 and 2011 were compared to ensure that dwellings were not missed and that all changes from 2006 to 2011 were recorded. Maps were reviewed to verify current boundaries and confirm that all population and dwellings within those boundaries were correctly allocated. The unoccupied dwellings were reviewed to ensure that the correct follow up action was taken to confirm their status.


The investigation found that an error had been made in the 2006 Census counts. In 2006, 164 people were incorrectly included in the population count of Inukjuak during the processing of the census data. This error affected only the population count and not the count of private dwellings. For 2006, the population of Inukjuak should have been 1,433 rather than the published count of 1,597.

Please note that Statistics Canada will not be publishing corrections to the 2006 Census counts. However, this correction should be taken into consideration when making comparisons between recent censuses. With the revised population count for 2006, the population of Inukjuak grew from 1,294 in 2001 to 1,433 in 2006, and to 1,597 in 2011. The growth rate from 2006 to 2011 was 11.4 %, close to that of the Territoire Équivalent of Kativik as a whole, which after the 2006 correction was 13.5 %.

The investigation of the data for the village of Inukjuak did not find any evidence of errors with the 2011 Census population and dwellings counts. Therefore, no adjustments to those counts for the 2011 Census of population will be made.
