Only 2% of full-time jobs pay less than \$20,000 per year in 2005 and one quarter pays between \$20,000 and \$29,999 annually. Another 38% provide annual salaries between \$30,000 and \$39,999, while 20% give between \$40,000 and \$49,999 and 15%, \$50,000 or more.
